## **ABSTRACT (CAPITAL, 14pt Times New Roman, Bold, Justified Left)**

This is a sample of the format of your full paper. Use Word for Windows (Microsoft)(or an equivalent Word Processor with exactly the same “printing results”) by setting the margins -1.3 cm from right and -1.3 cm from left in the Microsoft Word package, or equivalently, by keeping 1.8 cm, real distance, from the right and 1.8 cm, real distance, from the left. Use single space, justified left and right in the text. Use the double-column format after the Key words, and before References. Use 11pt Times New Roman in the text. Key words: - Leave one blank line after the Abstract and write your Key words (6 - 10 words).

## **1 INTRODUCTION (CAPITAL, 14pt Times New Roman, Bold, Justified Left)**

As you can see for the title of the paper you must use 18pt, Bold, Times New Roman, and justified left. Leave one blank line and then type Author's Name (in Natural Order, 12pt Times New Roman, Bold, Justified Left), Department (in 12pt Times New Roman), University (in 12pt Times New Roman), Address (in 12pt Times New Roman), Country (in 12pt Times New Roman). Then you must type your e-mail address and your web site address, as appropriate (both in 12pt Times New Roman).

The heading of each section should be printed in capital letters, 14pt Times New Roman, bold, and left justified, as above. You must use numbers 1, 2, 3, ... for numbering the

sections, and not Latin numbering (I, II, III, ...). All text is justified left and right, except for mathematical equations and formulas.

## **2 PROBLEM FORMULATION (CAPITAL, 14pt Times New Roman, Bold, Justified Left)**

Please, leave two blank lines between successive sections as here. Mathematical formulas and equations must be numbered as follows: (1), (2), ..., (99) and not (1.1), (1.2),..., (2.1), (2.2),... depending on your various sections. Mathematical formulas and equations are justified left.

When including a subsection you must use, for its heading, small letters, 12pt Times New Roman, bold, and justified left, as above.

### **2.1.1 Sub-subsection (11pt Times New Roman, Bold, Justified Left)**

When including a sub-subsection you must use, for its heading, small letters, 11pt Times New Roman, bold, and justified left, as above.

## **3 PROBLEM SOLUTION (CAPITAL, 14pt Times New Roman, Bold, Justified Left)**

Figures and Tables should be numbered as follows: Figure 1, Figure 2, Table 1, Table 2,..., etc. If your paper deviates significantly from these specifications, our
